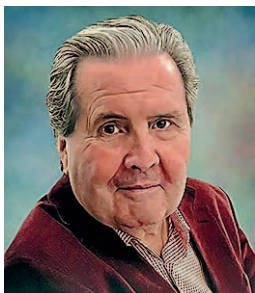


MICHAEL R. FLYNN



Michael R. "Mickey" Flynn, 82, of Washington, passed away peacefully on Wednesday, July 24, 2024, in his home, with family and friends by his side.
