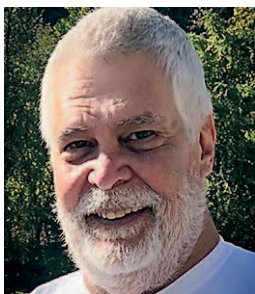


EDWARD R. MUNDIE
