Communion.

Judy enjoyed life and was always on the go. She enjoyed traveling to Los Angeles, California and Las Vegas, Nevada to visit her daughter, granddaughter and great-granddaughter. She loved the arts and would frequent the cultural district to attend plays, musicals, operas, ballets and the symphony. In her later years, she greatly enjoyed playing games and cards with her friends. Judy was an avid Bingo player, and would often be seen playing 4 or more boards at a time. In the afternoon and evenings, she could frequently be found relaxing with her word search puzzles, or watching Jeopardy and The Wheel of Fortune. She loved good food and eating out, and her favorite snacks included Butter Snaps pretzels, chocolate candy, and Jello. She also made sure to keep a bottle of Red Hot hot sauce and Kroops Arizona Heat mustard with her at most times. She would say they made anything taste good! Family and friends will treasure her memories every time they recall receiving a birthday or holiday card from her in the mail, just to make us feel special and loved. Judy will also be remembered lovingly for her strength, quick wit and sass.

Judy was preceded in death by her daughter, Donna Jean Thompson; and her twin brothers, James Monroe DeHonney III and Jan Michael DeHonney.
