Biko always had a love for cars. He was a self-taught auto body mechanic. The first car that he restored was a Camero where he painted his signature vibrant flames on the entire hood of the car. He owned a thriving antique car restoration shop in Houston, TX called, Frank's Oldies but Goodies.

His love and passion for art started as a young child and was incorporated in everything that he did. In high school he submitted some of his artwork in the Pittsburgh Arts Festival. He was a multifaceted artist and became a nationally recognized artist. He was a curator at the Black Rainbow Gallery in Omaha, NE. He received numerous acknowledgements and awards throughout Pittsburgh and the surrounding areas. He had the pleasure of exhibiting his artwork at the Andy Warholl museum, Mattress Factory, Penn State and various galleries in the tri-state area. He was the founder and president of The Museum of the African's Experience in America. His highest honor was his exhibition of The Museum of the African's Experience at 601Artspace gallery in New York City.

Bikó will continue to make art in the heavens with the many artists that preceded his death. Biko left this earth and joined a joyous, glorious and welcoming family reunion with his parents, his sister, multiple aunts and uncles, numerous cousins and friends.
