

DR. MARY LOU (SIEVERTSON) KELLER



Ph.D., R.N. and educator, passed away peacefully on September 16, 2024, at the age of 90, with her family present at Masonic Village. Mary Lou was born in Pittsburgh, on December 8, 1933, to the late Allan and Mary (Evans) Sievertson. Keller, who she married on July 9, 1955; her son, Eric Keller; and her sister, Joanne Hall. She is survived by her daughters, MaryAnne Boff (the late Michael Boff) and Donna Mittner (the late John Mittner); five grandchildren, nine great-grandchildren; and her brother, Allan Sievertson, Jr.
