the Student Council. After retiring from teaching, Ken transitioned full-time to the "family business" as a stagehand for the International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees Local #3 (IATSE). He had worked part-time with IATSE since the age of 18 and to build a career spanning over 50 years. went on Throughout his life, Ken was a dedicated advocate for union

rights and causes.

Outside of work, Ken was a lifelong fan of the Steelers, Pirates, and Pitt Panthers. He also dedicated his time to athletic, Catholic, and community causes. coached baseball at the Pony League, American Legion, and City League High School levels. In soccer, he coached both outdoor and indoor teams, was a founding member of the Pleasant Hills Soccer Club, helped establish the Century V Soccer Club, and served as President of the North Hills Soccer Club. Off the field, Ken volunteered with the Mount Washington Community Development Corporation, Mary's of the Mount Alumni Committee, and other local initiatives.

Ken also served as the president of the Mike Creighton oundation. Under Ken's leadership, the foundation Foundation. celebrated its 15th annual golf tournament and luncheon this year. The event brought together business and community leaders from across the Pittsburgh region, raising funds to support the educational advancement of college students and furthering the foundation's mission.

In recognition of his efforts, Ken "Fish" Gianella was inducted into the Mt. Washington Hall of Fame in 2020.

Of all Ken's accomplishments, his greatest pride was being a father and grandad. He was deeply proud of his family and the people they have become.
