Of Marietta, GA, passed away peacefully on Saturday, September 28, 2024, surrounded by loved ones. He was 63. Bob is survived by his devoted wife, Cindy; children, Emily and Luke; siblings, Karen (Frank) Grzywinski, Janet (Ron) Fabin, John M. (Sherry Campbell), Eileen (Mark) Strellick, Carol (Jim) Loutzenhiser and Michael, and nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his loving parents John and

Bob grew up in Stowe Twp., and graduated from Sto-Rox High School. He earned a degree in journalism from Duquesne University. In 1984, he became Sports Information Director at Marist College in Poughkeepsie, NY, where he made many life-long friends. In 1985, Bob married Cindy Snyder, a fellow Pittsburgher. In 1990, they moved to Marietta, GA, where Emily was born in 1997 and Luke in 2000.

Bob returned to college at Georgia State University, completing a history degree and a master's degree in education. He taught at Milton High School in Alpharetta and Cambridge High School in Milton for 28 years. He was dedicated to his students and valued by his colleagues. Many students have kept in touch with him for years and credit him with their love of history, work ethic, and desire to learn. He also coached basketball and golf and enjoyed being part of state championship teams. Bob loved all sports and maintained a passion for Pittsburgh teams. During Penguin and Steeler games he would have multiple text chains going with family and friends-complaining and critiquing.
