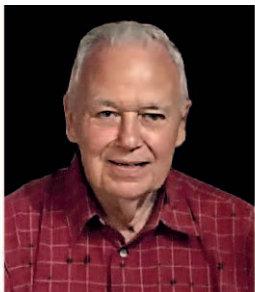


JOHN R. BROWN
