Richard and his wife, Mary Anne, enjoyed many trips earned by achieving various brand dealer of excellence awards, at one point earning the BMW honor six consecutive years

Throughout his life, he was an early adopter of technology including the first car phones and iPhones. He loved all including the first car phones and iPhones. He loved all sports, but especially baseball, both as a player in his youth and as a lifelong Pittsburgh Pirates fan. He volunteered as a family liaison in the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center Emergency Department, and received many awards including Volunteer of the Year.
