Joan firmly believed in the importance of improving the larger world, believed in the importance of improving the larger world, helping to found Pittsburgh's La Leche League, advocating for recycling "before it was cool," co-creating the Brookside Farms Herpetological Society, serving on many committees and ministries at St. Thomas More Catholic Church and School, and working diligently with her husband to protect the unborn. As her children grew, her artistic talents re-emerged. In the 1980s she became active in the Upper St. Clair League for the Arts, drew commissioned charcoal and pastel portraits, and illustrated fashion ads for local department stores that appeared in the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette and Pittsburgh Magazine. As an artist her whole life, she taught us to recognize the beauty in all of creation. She remained a trusted role model as a wife and mother: gracious, understanding, warm, and welcoming to friends, and offspring; and dependable, humble, and whenever anyone needed advice of any kind. partners, and helpful

In 1990, on the day their youngest child left for college, Joan and Robert took Joan's parents into their Upper St. Clair home for them to live out their days comfortably, continuing the dedication to family that marked Joan's entire life. Joan was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Robert; her parents, Sylvester and Barbara; her brothers, Philip, Sylvester, and Ronald; her sister, Barbara; and her grandchild, Tess.
