
FRANK J. PERZAK



On December 30, 2024, Frank J. Perzak, age 92, of Pleasant Hills, passed away. Beloved husband of 54 years to the late Sally J. (Skinkle) Perzak; son of the late Frank and Mary (Kusmirak) Perzak; brother of the late Norma (Victor) Szalajda; survived by two nephews, Frank (Mara) and Jonathan Szalajda, and Richard Zagrocki.

Dr. Perzak was raised, educated, and worked in Pittsburgh all his life, except

for his service in the Army. He held an undergraduate degree in chemistry from Carnegie Mellon, and a doctorate in chemistry from the University of Pittsburgh. He was employed as an occupational safety and health, research chemist, by the U.S. Department of the Interior, Bureau of Mines, for over 40 years. He was an expert in Fires and Explosives research and often fondly recalled his work experiences, including his research with ammonium nitrate, the fire behavior of mine materials, and fire gallery studies in mines. Frank was recognized upon his retirement with the Department of the Interior Superior Service award in acknowledgement of his career's accomplishments.

Frank had a love of travel and had wonderful memories of trips with his beloved wife, Sally. They traveled extensively across the United States, and internationally to Europe and Australia. A favorite memory of his was seeing the wildflowers of Yankee Boy Basin in Colorado. He had a love of water, and his family will long remember adventures shared boating on Pittsburgh's rivers.
