
DR. LESTER J. BOLANOVICH



Born in St. Louis, MO, on December 26, 1925, Lester J. Bolanovich passed from this world peacefully on Wednesday, January 22, 2025. He was also a member of the Pittsburgh Psychoanalytic Institute. Lester's passion and joy was two-fold, his family and his patients. He was a generous man, ever ready to offer his experience and "advice," as well as financial assistance, to both family and friends. During his medical and psychiatric practice of over 60 years, he provided valuable and skillful treatment to his patients, who loved him well, many of whom were with him for decades. Lester is survived by his three children and their families, Lisa Wroblewski (Ráy), Susan Washburn (Jim), and John Bolanovich (Allison). He was "Papa" to Andrew Wroblewski (Nicole), John Wroblewski, Benjamin and Caroline Washburn, and Noah and Kirah Bolanovich; and he was "Grandpapa" to Emmanuel and Augustin Wroblewski.
