
ROY ARTHUR MARBURGER



The founder of a business in Pittsburgh's steel industry and the last surviving grandchild of the couple whose progeny built one of western Pennsylvania's largest dairy farms has died. Roy Marburger was 94.

His grandparents owned the 200-acre Marburger Farm outside Evans City, Butler County, and gave it to their sons. One of the sons, Roy's uncle, founded Marburger Farm Dairy next to the farm

in 1938.

With one brother and five sisters, Roy was the youngest of Victor and Hazel Marburger's children. Despite the Great Depression and World War II, all graduated from college.

A 1951 Grove City College graduate, Roy became a mechanical engineer and married Janet Lindsey of New Castle. He served stateside in the army for two years at a

base that stored chemical weapons.

Roy and Janet then moved to the Pittsburgh area. They lived in McCandless Township, North Hills, where they had four children. They stayed nearly 70 years before moving to Florida in 2024.

With an MBA from Duquesne University, Roy co-founded Dynamic Equipment Corporation in 1979 as its president. In a plant on Pittsburgh's North Side, Dynamic produced heavy equipment that manipulated hot steel. Forging mills across the country used Dynamic's machines.

Roy retired in 2016 at 86 and sold the company. "Very creative problem solver," a client stressed.

"He loved a good story and could tell one, too," a friend said.

Roy Arthur Marburger died on January 10, 2025, in his home in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, where he lived with Janet, who has survived him. They were married for over 72 years.

His surviving children: David, Cleveland, OH; Dan, Fountain Hills, AZ; Sally Mark, Palm Beach Gardens, FL; and Susan (Dan) Shannon, Leonardtown, MD. He had seven grandchildren.
