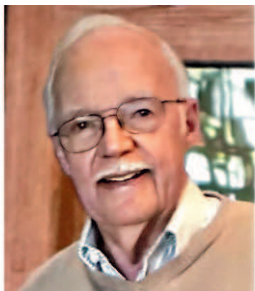


HAROLD F. DALFOL
