Age 83, a long-time resident of Cecil Township, passed away peacefully, on Monday, February 3, 2025.

Born June 25, 1941, in Santiago, Pennsylvania, Doug was the fifth child of the late Alfred Alexander and Lucy Boyd Coulter. A proud graduate of Hickory High School, Class of 1959, he went on to serve his country in the United States Navy from 1959 to 1962 then in the Navy Reserves until 1965. He

trained as a piping draftsman through General Dynamics in Groton, Connecticut and continued that career path until his partial retirement in 2008. Even after retiring, he remained active, working for Woltz & Wind Ford, delivering automotive parts until 2020.

Doug had a deep love for westerns such as *The Rifleman* and *Gunsmoke*, as well as films starring Clint Eastwood and John Wayne.
