World travel, including frequent visits to India, and many weekends spent skiing at Hidden Valley Resort made for wonderful family memories. While at home, she graciously hosted frequent dinner parties for colleagues and friends, gaining a reputation as a natural party planner and organizer. As the children went on to college and careers, she continued to volunteer extensively, holding appointments as President of the Allegheny County Medical Society Auxiliary and as a member of the Pittsburgh Opera Association, and helped establish the Indian Nationality Room in the Cathedral of Learning at the University of Pittsburgh. One of her most rewarding memories was a month of volunteer work at a women's hospice in India run by Mother Theresa herself. She eventually shifted her efforts toward caring for her mother, who also suffered from Alzheimer's disease with both she and Barbara providing loving home care for nearly a decade. Kate began a new role as grandmother in 2011, making frequent trips from Pittsburgh to Columbus. She enjoyed every moment spent watching the many talents of her granddaughter; a gymnast, Irish dancer, and now Captain of her 8th grade volleyball team.
