
PAUL KENAH DODWORTH JR.



89, passed peacefully, on February in Washington, Pennsylvania, surrounded by his family.

Born on June 21, 1935 to Kenah Dodworth and Pitcairn Daub, in the Pittsburgh borough Bellevue, Paul dedicated his life to music and education. He earned a Master's degree Music from Carnegie Mellon University and went on to share his passion as the

elementary music teacher for Trinity School District in Washington, PA. He also served as a substitute teacher in many area schools and worked at the Bethel Park School District. Beyond the classroom, Paul was a devoted organist and choir director at the Sheridan Presbyterian Church. He was a member of the American Guild of Organists, where he met his wife, Janet, and was a singer in Pittsburgh's Mendelssohn and Bach Choirs.

Paul proudly served his country in the U.S. Army and was stationed in France. He was a member of the Army band and used his time abroad to study the great gothic cathedrals of Europe. His love for classical music, pipe organs, cathedrals, architecture, trains, history and his hometown of Pittsburgh remained central throughout his life. He also cherished time spent at Stoney Lake, Ontario, Canada, a place that held special meaning for him and his family; he once rode his bicycle from his home in Bellevue, PA to the family cottage in Canada.

Paul was preceded in death by his beloved wife. Janet Balentine Dodworth. He is survived by his sons, John and daughters-in-law, Robyn and grandchildren, Čia, John, Jr., Evan, Rowan, and Fintan; sister, Be-Be (Catherine) Stroebel; brother-in-law, Hal Stroebel; and brother-in-law, Charlie Balentine. Also survived by nieces,

Wendy and Robin; and nephew, Kenneth.
