Beginning in 1997, Jean commenced her own practice as a clinical social worker, where she continued to serve the community, working alongside her husband at Advanced Diagnostics.

Beyond her professional achievements, Jean was a tireless advocate for animals and animal rights. She worked as an animal rescue agent for American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, while living in St. Thomas. Throughout her life, she rescued dozens of dogs, cats and was largely responsible for the building of the Cumberland Valley Humane Society Animal Shelter. Her love for dancing remained a life-long passion. She also found joy in traveling the world with her family, particularly her parents and sister and cultivating beautiful orchids. Those who knew her cherished her spontaneous sense of humor and the warmth

she brought into every room.
