Dick proudly served his country in the U.S. Army during the Korean War Era, stationed in Austria. After graduating Duquesne University with a degree in Business Administration, Dick spent much of his professional career as a salesman for Dillon Business Furniture in Pittsburgh, furnishing many offices in major law firms and the state and federal courts. He truly enjoyed his work, whistling on his way out the door in the morning and again when he arrived home at night. Dick had many good years of retirement with his wife, Pat. They spent winters in The Villages. He played golf almost every day and he enjoyed pinochle. He was always the first one on the dance floor. Dick was beloved by his family, neighbors and friends and a few canine companions. A man of deep faith, he was an active parishioner for 65 years at St. Bernadette Catholic Church in Monroeville.
