
KEVIN CHARLES SONTHEIMER



Kevin Charles Sontheimer was born March 6, 1938, and died at age 86, in Tucson, AZ, on February 3, 2025. He was the 11th and youngest child of Frederick W. Sontheimer and Mary I. Mitchell. After holding faculty positions at Virginia Tech and SUNY Buffalo, he moved to the Department of Economics at the University of Pittsburgh in 1978, where he served on the

faculty until his retirement in 2006.

his career pursued Throughout research in he microeconomic theory, with articles published in Econometrica and other top academic journals. He was also a visiting Professor at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, CA, and at the University of Mannheim in

At Pitt, he served as department chair for eight years, where he made transformative contributions to faculty recruitment and other efforts. He also secured a Mellon Foundation grant to co-found the Center for Economic Research and Graduate Education (CERGE) at Charles University in Prague in 1991. After Czechoslovakia split into the Czech and Slovak Republics, Kevin also worked with Academia Istropolitana Nova and Comenius University in Bratislava, Slovakia, helping to rejuvenate the teaching and study of economics in Eastern Europe at a time tremendous economic transition. After retiring, he and Carol divided their time between Pittsburgh and Bradenton, FL,

and then moved to Tucson in December of 2013. Kevin was an avid educator, youth math tutor, student, world traveller, and food enthusiast. He enjoyed reader. hiking, backpacking, camping, photography, He was an accomplished scuba diver, attaining Rescue Diver certification and logging dives across the Caribbean Sea and Fiji. He was kind, selfless, and generous in every sense of the word. His remarkable life and accomplishments will remain bright in our memories, and continue to be felt both at home and abroad as his familial

and professional legacies evolve and flourish.

He is survived by his wife of nearly 65 years, Carol Sontheimer of Tucson; daughter, Leigh Ellen Sontheimer of Tucson; son, Erik Sontheimer and daughter-in-law, Catherine Brekus of Newton, MA; son, Steven Sontheimer and Sewickley, PA; daughter-in-law, Morgan Triplett of grandchildren, Claire Sontheimer, Rachel Sontheimer, and Tanner Sontheimer; and brother, Adrian ("Dink") Sontheimer; and sister, Sue Wilmot.
