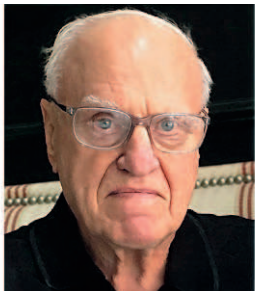


GEORGE M. HEIN
