

# **RALPH C. AFFINITO JR., DMD**

Age 82, of Pittsburgh, PA and Naples, FL, passed away peacefully, on Sunday, March 2, 2025, in Naples. Ralph was a beloved father, grandfather, brother, uncle and friend, whose legacy of kindness, compassion and generosity will live on in the hearts of all who knew him.

Born on May 25, 1942, in Monongahela, PA, Ralph was the son of Ralph C. Affinito, Sr. and Lena Dallo Affinito. He was a proud graduate of

Ralph's love of life extended beyond golf to music, particularly bluegrass music and the banjo. He found great joy in playing and learning, attending local jam sessions, bluegrass concerts and banjo retreats in Winchester, Virginia. His love of music, especially the banjo, was a significant part of his life and he enjoyed connecting with fellow musicians and music lovers.

Above all, Ralph was deeply proud of his family. He is survived by his children, David (Allison) Affinito and James (Kelly) Affinito; four cherished grandchildren, Ansley, Bailey, Wells and Collins Affinito; nieces, nephews, great-niece, great-nephew and many cousins. He was preceded in death by his sisters, Lilyan and Emma (John).
