Aaron Renee Colbert, born Jan Renee, 70, of Pittsburgh, passed away peacefully on February 27, 2025. Born in Shattuck, Oklahoma, on February 3, 1955, to Murray Dale Colbert and Miriam Ann Bockelman Colbert, Renee began her education on a flute scholarship at Southwestern Oklahoma State University, where she was the featured majorette. She later graduated from Oklahoma State University in
