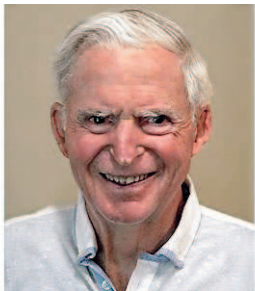


## TOM HOTOPP
